

## BURN PILE

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### Acceptable items:

Brush and tree wood  
under 5" in diameter

### Unacceptable items:

Painted, stained glued or  
pressure treated wood,  
plywood, chipboard,  
construction lumber,  
fiberboard or furniture

NOTE: The State of New  
Hampshire regulates and  
inspects the burn pile on a  
random basis. They have  
the authority to close the  
pile, fine the Town or both  
if contaminants are found.

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### HAZARDOUS WASTE:

HHW will not be accepted at  
this facility. HHW collections  
are scheduled at the Keene  
Recycle Center at no cost to  
Hancock Residents please  
see HHW flyer for dates

Oil based paint is considered HHW

### TRANSFER STATION PERMIT REQUIRED

Transfer Station Permits are available at  
the Town Office, please bring proof of  
residency, property ownership or  
affidavit from property owner.

Resident permits are issued by Town  
Clerk at time of vehicle registration. Non-  
resident permits expire at end of the year  
and require proof of property ownership  
or affidavit from property owner.

## RECYCLABLES

**OCC—Corrugated Cardboard:**  
must be separated from other paper, clean, dry and flattened.  
No wax coated cardboard please.

**MIXED PAPER:**  
Newspaper and inserts, magazines, mail, envelopes, computer paper, shredded paper, catalogs, paperboard (cereal boxes), paper shopping bags and other household paper

**ALUMINUM CANS:**  
Aluminum (except pet food cans) must be rinsed clean. Aluminum foil and plates are not recyclable

**TIN CANS:**  
All other metal containers such as pet food cans, empty latex paint cans, food cans—must be clean and dry

**ELECTRONICS:**  
Small electric appliances, computers related components, radios and TV's

## RECYCLABLES

**GLASS:**  
Glass bottles, porcelain sinks and toilets, ceramics, plates, window glass.  
All metal, plastic and wood parts must be removed.

**FLUORESCENT BULBS:**  
Must be deposited in designated location

**BATTERIES:** Rechargeable, automotive (alkaline batteries can be put in MSW)

**SCRAP METAL:**  
Scrap metal including non-Freon containing appliances may be placed in metal dumpster. All engines must be empty of fuel and oil

**USED MOTOR OIL:**  
Deposited in designated container (Synthetic oil cannot be accepted)



**#1 Plastic:** Soda, water, beer bottles, mouthwash, salad dressing bottles, vegetable oil bottles



**#2 Plastic:** Detergent bottles, milk jugs, juice bottles, shampoo bottles, butter, yogurt tubs & plastic grocery bags



**#3—7 Plastic:** No longer accepted

\* All bottles must be clean with caps removed and deposited into the appropriate window.

## CHARGEABLE ITEMS

**TIRES:** \*No tires on rims  
Charged by size \$3.00 minimum

**FREON CONTAINING APPLIANCES:**  
Refrigerators, freezers, AC Units, dehumidifiers  
\$15.00 per item

**DEMO/BULKY WASTE:**  
Furniture, mattresses, box springs, carpeting, shingles, sheet rock, pressure treated, stained, glued and painted wood  
\$20. 00 per car load  
\$40.00 per pickup truck load

## SWAP SHOP

The swap shop and library are for the exchange of clean usable items. Volunteer attendants or staff will determine suitability of any item.

- To be fair to all residents there will be a limit of the removal of 5 items per day.
- Nothing is to be left outside unless authorized by volunteers or staff.
